The Transition Project: Next steps


The Keycomm transition project which has been running since 2013 is coming to an end in May 2016. In light of the knowledge and experience gained from this project, the transition pathway for school leavers has been re-evaluated and adapted. We are currently moving from an AAC specific strand on the pathway to having a single pathway which is open to any young person with significant communication needs who will benefit from SLT support when leaving school and moving into adult services.

The Keycomm Transition project has provided an opportunity for joint working between paediatric and adult SLTs and it is felt that this was a really valuable and positive aspect of the project. Therefore, in the adapted pathway, there is a strong focus on strengthening links between paediatric and adult SLTs including the provision of joint training and knowledge sharing opportunities. Julie Gray (paediatric SLT) and Claire Smyth (adult SLT) are acting as points of contact to help co-ordinate the 2016 transition. Feedback on this year's transition process is welcomed in order to help identify new ideas or further changes needed for the future.

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AAC Scottish Government Legislation Update

The Scottish Government is introducing legislation for provision of voice output communication aids for all individuals living within Scotland. This legislation is now going through and the government has now formed an AAC working group of professionals, agencies, and AAC Users. This group will be developing **directions** to Health Boards which will consist of important information on the best way to provide the communication systems in a timely fashion and the importance of support for the individual and their supporters. The timescale for implementation of the legislation is still to be decided. Watch this space!

CODES Framework and Activity Toolkit

What is a successful AAC Communicator and how do we know the individual is an effective communicator?


If you are introducing an AAC system to an individual, you may want to use the **CODES** Framework to address the above question. The **CODES** Framework is a skill based framework and has been developed to monitor progress as you introduce an AAC system to an individual. It is based on Janice Light's communication competencies and consists of a quick look table of baseline skills, target planning sheets as well as questionnaires to measure an individual's motivation and resilience and to measure the policies and attitudes of a centre/school. This is everything you will need to begin to measure effectiveness of the AAC system over time.

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
There is now an Activity Toolkit which is a companion guide to the **CODES** Framework. The Activity Toolkit gives you ideas of different activities you can do to develop specific skills and competencies for an individual user. It also presents whole school/centre activities you might want to try out in your establishment.

The **CODES** Framework was developed originally to be used with children of all ages but is equally useful for individuals within the Post-16 age group.
